For the first half of Term 1 the students will be participating in many team building and fitness activities. The title of this unit is '**Effective Teams**'. Throughout this term students will be working within a team to complete a variety of challenges and activities, and will be studying what makes an effective team. This unit will incorporate a study of World War II specifically focusing on Kokoda and how mateship and teamwork helped the diggers overcome diversity. The finale of the study will be an excursion to the 1,000 Steps Kokoda memorial walk in the Dandenongs. We will be requiring adult assistance for most of our activities, so please tick the assistance box on the appropriate notices if you are able to assist. Please note, helpers are required to have a current Working with Children's Check. Your support would be greatly appreciated; the more the merrier with these activities!

Homework Expectations

Homework assists students in consolidating classroom learning, fosters positive study habits and provides them with an opportunity to show responsibility for their own learning. Homework will begin next week and will follow a homework matrix. Students will be able to pick certain choice activities while other activities will be non-negotiable. The matrix will include 2 hours of reading, Mathletics tasks set by the teacher, spelling focus words, Inquiry tasks and a selection of choice activities.

Homework will be set by the classroom teacher on Monday and will generally be due back to school on the following Monday. Below are some ways that you can assist your child with their homework:

- Encourage them to take increasing responsibility with their organisation
- Observe and acknowledge their successes and ask how they are going with any class/homework
- Encourage them to set aside time each day to complete their homework
- Help them to complete their homework by discussing key questions while also encouraging them to complete their homework independently
- Contact your child's teacher if they are having any concerns regarding homework commitments or expectations.

Communication



Grade 5 Maths

Our approach to the teaching and learning of mathematics at MEPS is through the 8 key factors, which are:

1. Teach Maths as a language
2. Focus on the Big Ideas
3. Teach Mathematical concepts using Maths literature and investigations
4. Topic based approach: Approximately 3 to 4 weeks per topic
5. Pre and Post-Test Topics
6. Teach Automatic Response
7. Teach the 9 Problem Solving Strategies
8. Student Reflections and Evaluation



Your child will participate in sessions that include these factors throughout the week, which enables point of need teaching for a range of learning styles. The classroom teacher sets Mathematics tasks each week which reflect areas being covered during class time. Teachers monitor and assess progress each week. If your child does not have access to the internet at home a note needs to be given to their teacher so that alternate arrangements can be made.

Grade 5 English



Teachers at Mt Eliza Primary School use the CAFÉ reading program to assess, instruct and monitor student progress in reading. It provides tools for constructing group and individual lessons that provide timely instruction and feedback, ensuring that all students reach their potential.

We are greatly advantaged to be able to offer students a range of books that fit their specific reading level by using a reading program called 'Literacy Pro,' through the Scholastic Learning Zone. Students are initially tested and given a Lexile score, which enables them to choose a personal book within their reading grasp. These Lexile books will be a part of their reading homework.

Grade 5 ICT

As we are using the 1:1 IPAD program this year, ICT will be incorporated throughout the curriculum in various situations.

Students are developing a range of skills that include:

- Cyber smart practice
- Creating and developing presentations
- Word Processing
- Using multimedia to communicate ideas
- Communicating electronically through See-Saw

Students and parents were asked to sign an acceptable usage policy that outlines the protocols students need to follow when accessing the school network (internet, emails and network folders). Most students have already returned these forms, if you have not, please see your child's teacher for another form.

Grade 5 Camp

We will be studying gold in Term 3 this year and we will be going to Sovereign Hill from the 11th – 13th September. More information regarding camp will come closer to the date.
