

Changing a Class

Policy

This policy was last ratified by School Council on 6/8/2018

Rationale:

When grades are allocated, all care is taken to ensure that in each class there is a range of:

- social types
- academic abilities
- behaviour types
- friendship groups

On very rare occasions, a situation may arise where consideration for a child to move classes within a school year may be considered. Developing a child's resilience is a cornerstone value of the school, therefore all avenues of support will need to considered and explored before a child is moved classes during the year.

Aims:

To ensure that children are provided with a consistent learning environment for the year, and learn to cope with differing teaching styles and peer/social groupings. To ensure all requests for mid-year class changes are dealt with fairly and consistently with the child's development and care at the centre of all decisions.

Implementation:

When a request is made by a parent to change a child's class, the following procedure will be adhered to:

- 1. A meeting with Principal/Assistant Principal and class teacher, to determine the reasons for this request.
- 2. Development of an Individual Learning Plan within the class to resolve issues brought to the school's notice by the parent.
- 3. Possible changes in teaching strategies to suit the child's learning style will be considered.
- 4. Student Welfare Teacher and Sub-School leader to be kept informed of the situation, and follow up with the child if necessary.
- 5. Every attempt will be made to ensure the child's educational and social well-being is catered for in the class before a change to the class is made.

The final decision for a child to move class mid-year lies solely with the Principal. A clear reason will be given for the decision to move or not move a child's class throughout the year. Issues of relationships with a child or teacher in the class will only be considered in the most extreme cases and after all reasonable strategies have been exhausted to improve the situation.
