Dear 2023 MEPS Parents and Carers,

We simply cannot do what we do at Mt Eliza Primary School (MEPS) without the collaboration of our families. The contributions you make towards your child's education significantly support the school's teaching and learning programs as well as making a huge difference to the opportunities that we can offer the children each year.

At MEPS, our engaging classroom programs are complemented by specialist subjects including **Physical Education**, **Performing Arts** (Music, Dance and Drama), **Visual Arts** and **LOTE** (Indonesian). We are excited to announce that in 2023, the specialist offering will be boosted by the addition of our **new STEM program**, led by Leading Teacher Mrs Amy Hille, which will run throughout the year for all classes.

Our School Council is proud of the excellent quality of the facilities and resources available for our students to enjoy, and **few schools match the numerous programs we offer to cater for students' needs and interests**. I want to take this opportunity to thank families for their contributions last year which have helped us to develop some of our iconic programs which will continue to expand in 2023. These include our **'Beyond the Gates' Nature Immersion Program** in the Early Years; the **OzHarvest Kitchen Garden Program** in the Middle School; and targeted **Leadership Programs** in the Senior School to name a few. However, these do not come without considerable costs.

As such, we would like to advise you of the school's voluntary financial contributions for 2023. You may have referred to these in the past as 'school fees'. **All payments are through our online provider, Campion**. Please see the attachments for details about your Year Level payment list, how to order and payment online.

We acknowledge the challenges that families have experienced over the past few years and, as a result, want to ensure transparency in sharing what your financial contributions actually fund. The **2023 Parent Contributions** consist of the following categories:

- 1. Individual Education Items Book pack and stationery requirements. Order and pay online through Campion packs delivered directly to school before Term 1 commencement. Book pack items are selected specifically to ensure consistency across each year level and, unfortunately, items cannot be purchased individually. I understand that you may have surplus supplies at home from previous years. If so, please do not hesitate to donate these to the school so that we can resource our 2023 lunchtime clubs. Just bag them up and bring them to the office; any extra supplies would be greatly appreciated. An exciting addition in 2023 includes the introduction of our new Student Diary, which has been developed in conjunction with the Resilience Project. Please note that all students, Prep to Year 6, will require this Diary for next year.
- 2. **Curriculum Contributions -** Curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum. Payment online through Campion.

Curriculum Contributions assist the school to provide rich, wide-ranging programs and resources outside the traditional teaching and learning programs. It also supports the ongoing provision of targeted Reading and Numeracy materials used to personalise the learning for each MEPS student.

Your support in 2023 allows us to:

- provide high quality programs and **specific subject materials and equipment** for English, Mathematics, Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Indonesian, PE and Sport, Inquiry and STEM. A slight increase in contributions in this area for 2023 takes into consideration the addition of the new STEM specialist program.
- ensure the **upkeep of our computer devices** to enhance learning opportunities. An increase in contributions in this area for 2023 will fund the upgrade and maintenance of our computer network system; provision, purchase and upkeep of school devices, including the leasing of iPads/laptops for student use; and payment of whole school licences and apps, such as: Mathletics, Reading Eggs and Literacy Pro as well as online standardised assessments (e.g., PAT and Essential Assessment).
- maintain sufficient class sets of books for students to develop their reading skills
- provide hands on maths equipment i.e. measuring materials for teaching purposes
- deliver a range of sporting equipment and experiences

3. **Other Contributions -** Non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives. Payment for these are also online through Campion.

Your support in 2023 includes provision of the following:

- student and parent communication tools. An increase in contributions in this area in 2023 will
 assist us to facilitate the transfer from Sentral to the COMPASS Management & Communication
 System, resulting in enhanced parent communication outcomes as well as provision for cyber
 safety workshops for families.
- enhanced wellbeing support, such as targeted wellbeing programs and a social worker/school counsellor in 2023
- school buildings and grounds maintenance and enhancement
- effective first aid for all students and hygiene costs
- Library maintenance and enhancement

Please note the option to also contribute to Phase 2 of our *Library Refurbishment Project*. We are so grateful for your contributions to date, and aim to commence work over the upcoming holidays. We now have a wonderful opportunity to redevelop our Library into a welcoming hub for research, creative thinking and literacy learning. Here is a sample of what we envision our Library to look like thanks to the contributions of our MEPS community, with a special thanks to parents Sheree Cullin and Georgie Mayo.







4. Extra Curricular Items and Activities - Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free in order to deliver the Curriculum. Extra-Curricular Items and Activities are provided on a user-pays basis and includes programs at MEPS in 2023 such as: Middle School OzHarvest Kitchen Garden Program in Years 3 and 4. Payment online through Campion.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Please note that we anticipate that excursions and camps will be paid for online through the COMPASS portal from 2023. More information about this will follow next year, together with information about the excursion levy.

Financial Support for Families

Mt Eliza Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options. Families can apply for State Government or community support programs such as the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and State Schools Relief.

The ongoing support of our families ensures that Mt Eliza Primary School can offer the best possible education and support for our students. These programs and events are essential in being able to provide the rich learning opportunities that foster our belief in developing the whole child. FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot
 pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
