

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - MS KIM WHEELER

Dear Parents and Carers,

Many of you may be aware that in 2024, Mt Eliza Primary School is celebrating 150 years of excellence in education. During these 150 years, Mt Eliza Primary School has been committed to providing an education for students that is high quality and progressive. Over the years, Mt Eliza Primary School has evolved into a dynamic educational organisation with its own distinctive identity. We draw on our strong traditions as we continue to educate future generations for the ever-changing landscape they face.



Our incredible story started in a 'shed' not too far from our current site in the 1800s. The school went through a period of being open and closed a few times until student numbers consolidated. The building we call the Old School House moved from Parkdale to its present site in 1929 and we are proudly considered the first continuous primary school in the area. This building stands proudly at the front of the school. Importantly, this school house was saved from demolition in 2004 by a group of hard working and passionate members of our school community. Thank goodness, as the Old School House is a reminder to us of the school's ongoing commitment to exceptional education.

Since its inception, Mt Eliza Primary School has been synonymous with a strong sense of community spirit. In partnership with our community, we have developed a culture that reflects our five values:

Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, Connectedness and Challenge

These values are the cornerstone of what we do; they support our approach to learning and are key to the way in which we develop respectful relationships across the school. It is at Mt Eliza Primary School that ex-students often speak of how they developed deep friendships that have continued through and after school. We also have many inter-generational family members returning time and time again as students, visitors and volunteers.

We are looking forward to a number of touchpoints throughout the year which will give us the opportunity to celebrate our 150-year anniversary. 

EARTH DAY WINNERS ANNOUNCEMENT

SPOTLIGHT ON CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS

I have the enviable opportunity to visit classrooms on a regular basis and am always blown away by the variety of learning experiences and the manner in which our students can articulate 'what' they are learning and 'why'.

From creative projects to immersion in the curriculum, here's a glimpse into what's been happening in our classrooms:

Global Connections via LOTE:

With the world at our fingertips, our students have been exploring diverse cultures and perspectives through their immersion in Indonesian language and cultural studies. Here are Year 4 expanding their horizons and developing a deeper understanding of the world around them.

Mathematics in Action:

Fractions are in the spotlight in Year 3, with students learning about

mathematical terminology including numerators and denominators using pizzas as a way to visually demonstrate fractional portions.



Language Experiences:

Students in our Early Years cohorts (Prep to Year 2) have been consolidating their English skills through writing practise, responding to texts, rehearsing their sounds, discussing the names of shapes and learning about grammatical structures, just like 2M who have been learning all about antonyms.





Our Year 6 cohort have been focusing on language experiences through word study, grammar and listening skills. In making links to their inquiry unit on space and the planets, the Year 6s have been listening to the year level novel, 'The Little Prince' by Antoine de Saint-Exupery. The story follows a young prince who visits various planets, including Earth, and addresses themes of loneliness, friendship, love and loss.

You can see the students in 6W highly focused on the novel while creating visual representations of what they are hearing. Students in 6D and 6G were more highly focused on the 'nuts and bolts' of language, working on grammatical and spelling conventions such as declarative language and adding suffixes to words. I was really impressed by the way in which the Year 6s were working!



Taking the Learning Beyond the Gates - Year 5 1000 Steps Challenge

I am excited to share with you the incredible journey that our Year 5 students embarked upon last Friday as they conquered the 1000 Steps Challenge, an adventure that not only tested their physical endurance but also deepened their understanding of history and resilience.

Located in the picturesque Dandenong Ranges National Park, Melbourne, the 1000 Steps Challenge is more than just a fitness activity; it is a poignant reminder of the sacrifices made by Australian soldiers during World War II. This iconic trail is known as the Kokoda Track Memorial Walk, paying homage to the brave soldiers who fought along the gruelling Kokoda Track in Papua New Guinea.

Accompanied by MEPS staff and family volunteers, our students set out on this memorable journey, eager to tackle the steep ascent of 1000 steps. As they climbed higher, they were not only met with physical challenges but also with opportunities for reflection and connection. They paused at various points along the trail to absorb the stories of courage and sacrifice, gaining a newfound appreciation for the resilience of the human spirit. They encouraged and supported each other every step of the way, embodying the values of teamwork and camaraderie.



The 1000 Steps Challenge provided our students with a unique opportunity to connect with history, nature and each other. It was a day filled with laughter, learning and a shared sense of purpose. We are incredibly proud of our Year 5 students for embracing this adventure wholeheartedly and for embodying the spirit of resilience and determination.

Dear Parent / Caregiver / Guardian,

This letter is to inform you about the 2024 Student Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS), which will be administered to all government school students in Years 4 to 12.

About the survey

The AtoSS is a voluntary annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools and the department to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and will be asking your child about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

ORIMA Research Pty Ltd has been contracted by the department to administer the online survey and will provide support to schools throughout the survey period via a telephone hotline and email.

This year, the survey will be conducted at your school from 13th May until 14th June.

What are the benefits?

Young people enjoy having a say! This survey has been running for nearly 20 years and is invaluable in helping schools understand student views to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. The survey responses also help the Department of Education understand how student's learning experiences can be improved.

What are the risks?

While we do not anticipate many risks of participation, some students may find some of the survey questions personal and sensitive in nature. Should you agree for your child to participate, they are still free to skip questions or to withdraw at any stage if the survey makes them upset or uncomfortable. A teacher will be present during the survey to support students.

The questions are selected from validated survey instruments used in Australia and around the world, are strength-based, and tailored for each year level group.

What will my child be asked to do?

Your child will be invited to complete the survey online during class time using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Please note:

- Student participation in the survey is voluntary and students may withdraw at any time.
- The survey is available in a variety of different versions to enable all students to participate.
- The survey will take around 20-45 minutes to complete.

How is my child's confidentiality protected?

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey from their teacher. The student login is an assigned identifier that will be used by the department to link data for analysis and research purposes only. Identifiable information, such as student name or Victorian Student Number (VSN) is **not** used for linking datasets. Some student demographic data (i.e. year level, gender, age, Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander status) is derived from department-held

administrative records and is linked to the individual student login ID during survey set up work to support survey administration.

ORIMA Research will only use student personal information for research purposes to facilitate the administration and data collection of the Attitudes to School Survey. To ensure the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times, personally identifiable data will not be recorded in the survey response file that ORIMA Research provides to the department. All data is stored on servers located in Australia and access is restricted to staff who are working on the project.

All information collected about your child will be handled in accordance with the *Privacy Data and Protection Act 2014* (Vic), the *Health Records Act 2001* (Vic) and the *Public Records Act 1973* (Vic), as well as the Department's <u>Schools' Privacy Policy</u>. Please note that consistent with the above legislation and our policy, there are instances where we may be required by law to share information provided by your child. For example, where there is a threat to your child's health and safety.

How will results be reported?

Aggregated state-wide survey data will be used to report on initiatives and may also be used in public discussions of issues relating to student engagement and wellbeing. An example of how survey data has been previously used includes reporting levels of student engagement in the Performance Summary in the Annual Report to the School Community.

The survey results will also be reported back to the school in aggregate form throughout the survey period. Data or results about individual students will not be shared with schools. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Where there are low numbers of students, the data will be suppressed so that the school cannot view the results for that group.

Your school may share the results of the survey with parents and carers.

Options for participation

Participation in this survey is **voluntary**. If you **do not** wish for your child to do the survey, please opt out via email to your school: <u>jessica.merritt@education.vic.gov.au</u> before the survey commences on Monday May 13, 2024

Student personal information will be shared with ORIMA Research to facilitate survey preparations prior to this opt out process. If you opt your child out of participating, then your school will ensure that your child is not provided with access to the survey. Student details will be deleted by ORIMA Research at the conclusion of the survey.

If your school does not receive a Refusal of Consent email before the survey commencement date, as above, this will be taken as your consent for your child to participate in the 2024 Attitudes to School Survey. However, as noted above the survey is voluntary: even with your consent, your child can choose to skip questions or withdraw at any time.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
