

# SCHOOL SAVING INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

We understand that there has been confusion about the School Saving Bonus and the interim solution we have suggested to help.

## Please read this carefully!

**If you would like to use your SSB for activities/excursions NOW, you will need to allocate all or part of the balance to activities – please refer to page 6 of the attached guide for instructions.**

In Compass, some parents/carers have the option of using CSEF/credit/SSB for an activity by selecting a tick box. Apparently not all parents have this choice appear. We have highlighted this problem with Compass, and we are waiting on their advice that this problem has been rectified or the option of a SSB box added.

**In the interim, (after you have allocated the SSB to activities) if you cannot use the tick box on Compass, we will need you to go to “consent and pay” and type your name in full, then select – “submit consent”. See the graphic below. This will then identify that you have given permission for your child to attend and that we should allocate the SSB for payment. Once you have consented on compass please send an email to [ssb@mtelizaps.vic.edu.au](mailto:ssb@mtelizaps.vic.edu.au) with the following details – Child’s name, Name of excursion/Incursion and the cost.**

### 3 Consent and payment method

## ATTENDANCE



**It is important to note that if your child/ren will be absent, you must notify the school via the Compass Education App.** Compass Education provides a Parent Portal which includes the ability to mark your child/ren absent if you know your child/ren will be absent from school. Parents will need to download the Compass Education app to access this service (which is available on both Apple and Android devices).

Once on the Home Screen, please click on the “Add Attendance Note” banner button at the top of the page. From here parents can key in all information required for the absence, including dates, times and most importantly, the reason for the absence. Please note if parents do not enter their child’s absence, you will receive a text message letting them know that the child’s absence is unexplained, with a link to provide an Attendance Note on the Compass Education app.

# CSEF

The Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund (“CSEF”) helps ensure that no student misses out on important educational opportunities. To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a government school must:

- On the first day of Term One; or
  - On the first day of Term Two:
- a. Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card holder; or
  - b. Be a temporary foster parent; and
  - c. Submit an application to the school by the due date.

If you applied for CSEF last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your circumstances (e.g. change of school, change of family circumstances, change of name, change of concession card number or new siblings starting school).

You are welcome to submit your CSEF application form and health care card to the school office now.

**Please note:** Applications for CSEF close on **4 July 2025**.



## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

**Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.**

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$154 for primary school students
- \$256 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

# PREP 2025 CSEF PACKAGE

The Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund (“CSEF”) helps ensure that no student misses out on important educational opportunities. To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a Government school must:

- On the first day of Term One; or
  - On the first day of Term Two:
- a. Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card holder; or
  - b. Be a temporary foster parent; and
  - c. Submit an application to the school by the due date.

As part of the CSEF package, prep parents are entitled to a 2025 prep uniform package.

Applications for the Prep 2025 Summer CSEF Uniform Package are open now. You are welcome to submit your application form, order form and health care card to the school office now.

**Please note:** Application close at the end of Term 1 and vouchers have an expiry which must be redeemed before the expiration date.

## STATE SCHOOLS' RELIEF Prep 2025 Summer CSEF Uniform Package.

### UPDATE FOR FAMILIES.

Applications for the Prep 2025 Summer CSEF Uniform Package are now open.

### What you need to know.

#### Who is SSR?

State Schools' Relief (SSR) is a not-for-profit organisation that works closely with all government schools across Victoria. We provide assistance to families experiencing financial disadvantage with school uniforms, footwear and range of other essential educational items.

#### Introduction to Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

Through government funding the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) was established to provide payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports days and excursions. To find out more, or to apply for assistance, please refer to the [Department of Education website](#).

**SSR offers two uniform packages every year to all Prep families/carers eligible for CSEF funding.**

#### Prep 2025 Summer Uniform Package for CSEF recipients

Prep students for 2025 that are recipients of the Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) automatically qualify for this uniform package and/or voucher.

#### What's in the package?

The Prep 2025 summer package contains the following items:

Tops x 2 pcs (i.e., polo shirts / school dress)  
Bottoms x 2 pcs (i.e., shorts / skorts / trackpants)  
Outerwear x 1 pce (i.e., windcheater / bomber jacket / polar fleece jacket)  
Socks x 2 pairs  
Shoes x 1 pair

#### Please note:

- a) PE items are not included as part of this package
- b) Shoes must be requested in UK sizes (please see our shoe size conversion chart [here](#))

#### Cost to families

Where State Schools' Relief is unable to provide a uniform item directly that contains a logo (due to contractual agreements with uniform retailers) you will receive a voucher for \$85 that subsidises the cost of the items. The voucher can be redeemed at your child's school uniform shop or independent uniform retailer.

**Please note: vouchers do have an expiry date and must be used before this date.**

#### How do I apply for the Prep 2025 Summer CSEF Uniform Package?

Applications are made through your child's school. Please refrain from contacting State Schools' Relief directly as staff are unable to accept applications directly from parents/families. Should you have any questions, or wish to apply for assistance, please speak directly with your child's school.

#### How do I receive the uniform package?

1. All items and/or vouchers provided by SSR will be delivered directly to your child's school. The school will then contact you to arrange handover of these items and/or vouchers.
2. The voucher will advise whether you collect items from the school uniform shop or a retailer. If it's a retailer, please check with your school to find out the nearest store.

#### Please note:

Vouchers are not transferable and cannot be exchanged for cash. State Schools' Relief does not make cash payments to schools or parents/families.

### What you need to do.

Your child's school will be in contact with you regarding the 2025 Summer Uniform Package. Please fill out the 'Prep 2025 Summer CSEF Uniform Package Order Form' and return it to the school in order for them to submit the application.

To start primary school in 2026, your child will need to **turn 5 years old by 30 April 2026**. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old. Prep (Foundation) application for enrolment can be completed between the **22 April and the 25 July 2025**.

### How do I enrol my child in their first year of primary school?

1. Find your local school on the [findmyschool.vic.gov.au](http://findmyschool.vic.gov.au) website, which hosts the most up-to-date information about Victorian school zones. This will be updated from 22 April 2025.
2. Click to download the Prep (Foundation) enrolment information pack here. *(The pack will be available by Tuesday 22 April 2025 and will include an application form).*
3. Click to download the Factsheet for Prep (Foundation) enrolment 2026 [here](#)
4. Submit an enrolment application for Prep (Foundation) by **Friday, 25 July 2025**.
5. You will be notified of the outcome of your application between **Monday 28 July** and **Friday 8 August 2025**. If you receive an offer, you should accept the offer by **Friday 22 August 2025**.
6. Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions during Term 4 2025.
7. Your child will start Prep (Foundation) from a date advised by our school, in 2025.

<b>Term 2: Tuesday 22 April 2025 – Friday 4 July 2025</b>	
<b>Terms 1 and 2, 2025</b>	Primary schools conduct tours, information sessions and other activities for families seeking Foundation (Prep) enrolment for their child for 2026.
<b>By the start of Term 2, 2025</b>	School zones for the 2026 school year go live on <a href="https://findmyschool.vic.gov.au">findmyschool.vic.gov.au</a> Parents and carers should go to <a href="https://findmyschool.vic.gov.au">findmyschool.vic.gov.au</a> to locate their designated neighbourhood school (local school) for 2026. The Enrolment Information Pack for Parents and Carers is available to download from <a href="#">Enrolling in Foundation (Prep)</a> .
<b>From Week 1, Term 2 2025</b>	Primary schools may distribute the Enrolment Information Packs to prospective families and their local community.
<b>From Week 1, Term 2, 2025</b>	<b>Enrolment applications open</b> – parents and carers submit their completed enrolment application to a government primary school from this date.
<b>Term 3: Monday 21 July 2025 – Friday 19 September 2025</b>	
<b>By Friday 25 July 2025</b>	<b>Enrolment applications due</b> – parents and carers submit their completed enrolment application to a government primary school by this date.
<b>Between Monday 28 July and Friday 8 August 2025</b>	Primary schools notify parents and carers in writing of Foundation (Prep) enrolment outcomes, as per the department's Placement Policy. This may include a letter of offer, a letter confirming enrolment, or an unsuccessful application letter. Parents and carers sent an unsuccessful application letter may start submitting a written appeal to the primary school.
<b>By Friday 22 August 2025</b>	Parents and carers sent a letter of offer indicate acceptance of their child's place by this date.
<b>By Friday 22 August 2025</b>	<b>Closing date</b> for parents and carers to submit a written appeal to a primary school.
<b>By Friday 5 September 2025</b>	Primary schools notify all parents and carers, in writing, of the outcome of their appeal by this date.
<b>By Friday 19 September 2025</b>	<b>Closing date</b> for parents and carers to submit a written appeal with the relevant Regional Director, where they have been unsuccessful with their appeal to the primary school.
<b>Term 4: Monday 6 October 2025 – Friday 19 December 2025</b>	
<b>During Term 4, 2025</b>	Primary schools host transition sessions.
<b>By Friday 31 October 2025</b>	Regions notify all parents and carers in writing of the outcome of Regional Director appeals by this date. This only applies to appeals received by the closing date of Friday 19 September 2025.
