

PRINCIPAL REPORT – MICHAEL KENT

Hello everyone and welcome to the latest newsletter edition.

I hope you and your families are enjoying all that's been on offer across MEPS over the past couple of weeks. I would like to extend my utmost gratitude for the warm welcome I have received over recent weeks. As I come to the end of my third week at MEPS, I appreciate all the interactions and positivity that I've received. Thank you!

It has been great to slowly get to know many students, parents and staff. I am grateful to be working within such a great community. Clearly our school has a strong focus on providing a rich and engaging learning program for all students. I have noted that the school provides a unique breadth of experiences for the students to enjoy. An engaging learning program within the classrooms and also a value added and extensive learning program outside the classroom! I acknowledge the strength of the staff and their team approach in providing for our students. I also thank the parents and the wider school community for the obvious support that you provide each day to ensure the best learning opportunities can be delivered.

A reminder that Friday June 6th is a planned Curriculum Day, therefore students are not required to attend school on this day. During the day staff will be focused on assessment moderation and report writing which will lead to reports being published prior to our Parent/Teacher interviews later in the term. The Curriculum Day will be followed by the public holiday on June 9th. Therefore, students are not required at school until Tuesday 10th.

Reconciliation Week

Across the past week it has been wonderful to see the school acknowledging and reflecting on Reconciliation week. At its heart, reconciliation is about strengthening relationships between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non-Indigenous peoples, for the benefit of all Australians. For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, Australia's colonial history is characterised by devastating land dispossession, violence and racism. Over the last half-century, however, many significant steps towards reconciliation have been taken.

Reconciliation is an ongoing journey that reminds us that while generations of Australians have fought hard for meaningful change, future gains are likely to take just as much, if not more, effort.

In a just, equitable and reconciled Australia, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children will have the same life chances and choices as non-Indigenous children, and the length and quality of a person's life will not be determined by their racial background.

The vision of reconciliation is based and measured on five dimensions: historical acceptance; race relations; equality and equity; institutional integrity and unity. These five dimensions do not exist in isolation but are interrelated. Reconciliation cannot be seen as a single issue or agenda; the contemporary definition of reconciliation must weave all of these threads together. For example, greater historical acceptance of the wrongs done to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples can lead to improved race relations, which in turn leads to greater equality and equity.

The work and focus across our school, and that shared throughout the recent assembly allows our community to reflect, connect and recognise the significance of this week.

We recently celebrated our appreciation of Education Support Day! This was a timely opportunity to acknowledge the fantastic work of our education support team. The team all do an amazing job each and every day. Providing support for students, staff and parents in all that they do. I'm sure you and your children will join me in thanking our ES team!!

It has been wonderful to see so many amazing activities and events happening in and across the school over the past two weeks.

Year 4 FEAST program is in full swing and it has been a very engaging and enjoyable experience. Thank you to the parents who have supported this program. The students have done an amazing job and I can say from heart to stomach...I have enjoyed the recent provision of many foods from pizzas to apple crumble!

Prep Grandparents' Day was another wonderful opportunity that our community enjoyed this week. It was so great to see sooo many parents, grandparents and friends of the school coming in to enjoy the morning on Thursday. Along with their year 4 buddies, our Prep students enjoyed sharing in moments of reflection with their families and grandparents.

Special thanks to the families who attended and also to the Prep and year 4 staff for providing these memorable opportunities.

ENDEAVOUR NEWS

SHAPING TOMORROW'S LEADERS

Our specialised senior school initiative, the Endeavour Program, is dedicated to cultivating the leaders of tomorrow through the 3 core pillars of Challenge, Community and Capacity. Designed specifically for our Year 5 and 6 students, this program encourages them to embrace challenges, build meaningful connections within their community and enhance both personal and collaborative skills. Through engaging projects and real-world experiences, students develop resilience, empathy and a strong sense of responsibility, preparing them to make a positive impact in their communities and beyond.

TERM 1

CHALLENGE

In term 1, students actively engaged in activities designed to push them beyond their comfort zones and develop resilience. One highlight was the Survival and Camouflage excursion, where students participated in outdoor challenges that tested their adaptability and problem-solving skills. In the classroom, students delved into case studies of individuals who have overcome significant obstacles. Through these studies, they identified 20 effective strategies for facing challenges. To share their newfound knowledge and support their peers, students created informative posters aimed at younger students. These experiences have not only enhanced students' understanding of resilience but also equipped them with practical tools to navigate challenges in their own lives.

TERM 2

COMMUNITY

This term, students have explored what makes a strong community and worked collaboratively to brainstorm ways to make meaningful contributions to their local community. As a result, students are currently planning and executing both a clothing and cooking drive to support the Mornington Community Support Centre (MCSC). By engaging directly with community challenges, students gain a deeper understanding of the powerful impact they can have and the importance of active citizenship. We are incredibly proud of our students' dedication and the meaningful contributions they are making. Their efforts exemplify the spirit of the Endeavour Program and our school's commitment to fostering a culture of community engagement and service.

TERM 3

CAPACITY

In Term 3, our Year 5 and 6 students will embark on an engaging Electives unit designed to help them explore new interests and 'find their spark'. This unit encourages students to bravely step outside their comfort zones, discover new passions and enhance personal capacities. A key component of this unit is learning to set SMART goals—Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant and Time-bound objectives. By mastering this goal-setting framework, students will be better equipped to plan, monitor and achieve their personal goals, creating a sense of ownership and motivation in their learning journey. Through hands-on practical workshops, students will work towards acquiring new skills and gain insights into their personal growth, laying a strong foundation for future success.

STEM – MATTER MATTERS!

During STEM in Term 2, students have been investigating Chemical Science. They have been looking at the properties and behaviours of Matter and classifying them as either a solid, liquid or gas. They used playdough to create models to show how molecules behave in the 3 different states, and looked at materials that don't always follow the rules when it comes to trying to classify substances. They have learned about the viscosity (thickness) of different liquids and how the higher the viscosity the slower the liquid flows. Students became rather messy when they made Oobleck and tried to work out whether it was a solid or a liquid. According to Isaac Newton, 'The viscosity of a liquid does not change even when under pressure.' The students concluded that Oobleck was both a solid when under pressure and a liquid when not! Hence, the students learned that Oobleck was actually a non-Newtonian fluid!

The senior school investigated that one property of gas was its ability to be compressed, as opposed to liquid that takes the shape of the container it is in, with no room for compression.

Student comments

Maverick and Asher 4C: we made models of what solids, liquids and gases look like. We put a 'straw' in the liquid one. I made a sign for them as well as making them with Playdough.

Decklyn 4C - These are gas molecules that aren't attached to each other so they can move freely.


Jack 4A - It was so much fun doing the experiment!

Mabel and Ella 3H - The oobleck felt really strange, we needed to add a little more water, so it worked properly and then it went hard when we punched it but ran through our fingers when we stopped pushing it.

Bailey 6B - The sand compressed a little bit because there was air in between the particles of sand. The air compressed the most, the water didn't compress at all.



YEAR 6 TO 7 TRANSITION



Supporting students transitioning from Year 6 to Year 7 is a key shared priority for Mt Eliza Primary School and surrounding secondary schools. This process began when the official transition forms were sent home to students last term.

Currently, secondary schools have the transition forms and in accordance with the Placement Policy, letters will be sent home to families from **Tuesday, 1 July 2025**. An acceptance slip will be included with the outcome, which parents/carers will need to return to your child's teacher to accept or decline the secondary school enrolment. The acceptance slip must be returned to your child's teacher by no later than **Tuesday, 12 August 2025**.



SCHOOL SAVING INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

We understand that there has been confusion about the School Saving Bonus and the interim solution we have suggested to help.

Please read this carefully!

If you would like to use your SSB for activities/excursions NOW, you will need to allocate all or part of the balance to activities through the [SSB online system](#).

1. Log in using your unique SSB code from the Department of Education and email address.
2. Click School Activities
3. Select amount to nominate to transfer (this cannot be changed or reversed). Please allow 48 hours for transfer to take place (The amount does not appear on Compass – only your school account)
4. You will receive an email confirmation

After you have allocated the SSB to activities you will need to go to **“consent and pay”** and type your name in full, then select – **“submit consent”** (see the graphic below). This will then identify that you have given permission for your child to attend and that we should allocate SSB for payment. Once you have consented on compass, please send an email to ssb@mtelizaps.vic.edu.au with the following details – child’s name, name of excursion/IncurSION and the cost. **A reply may not always be received unless we require additional information.*

3 Consent and payment method

I give permission for [redacted] to attend this event. Where the staff member in charge is unable to contact me, or where it is impracticable to contact me, I authorise the staff member in charge to administer such first-aid as the staff member in charge judges to be reasonably necessary. Submit Consent

If the event is marked as,

- **“Awaiting consent and payment”** – You have not consented or paid for the event and must do so by the due date and your child may miss out.
- **“Awaiting payment”** this confirms that you HAVE consented to the event and SSB can be used. We will use the SSB on your child’s account (whereby SSB can be used as a form of payment). Please ensure to read the event description carefully as it will advise what forms of payment can be used.
- **“Attending”** – You have consented and paid/SSB has been allocated to payment

ATTENDANCE



It is important to note that if your child/ren will be absent, you must notify the school via the **Compass Education App**. Compass Education provides a Parent Portal which includes the ability to mark your child/ren absent if you know your child/ren will be absent from school. Parents will need to download the Compass Education app to access this service (which is available on both Apple and Android devices).

Steps to add an absence

1. Open the Compass App.
2. Click on your child's photo at the top of the Home Screen
3. Click on **Attendance**
4. Click the blue + icon
5. From here parents can key in all information required for the absence, including dates, times and most importantly, the reason for the absence.

****Please note if parents do not enter their child's absence, you will receive a text message letting them know that the child's absence is unexplained, with a link to provide an Attendance Note on the Compass Education app and a phone call may also be made from the school as a reminder if not actioned.***

If you received a text saying your child is absent

1. Click on the link in your text message OR Follow steps 1-2 above then,
2. Click the un-explained tab at the bottom
3. Select each unexplained absence date and complete

CSEF

The Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund ("CSEF") helps ensure that no student misses out on important educational opportunities. To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a government school must:

- On the first day of Term One; or
- On the first day of Term Two:
 - a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card holder; or
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

If you applied for CSEF last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your circumstances (e.g. change of school, change of family circumstances, change of name, change of concession card number or new siblings starting school).

You are welcome to submit your CSEF application form and health care card to the school office now.
Please note: Applications for CSEF close on 4 July 2025.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$154 for primary school students
- \$256 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

What you need to know.

Who is State Schools' Relief?

State Schools' Relief (SSR) is a not-for-profit organisation that works closely with all government schools across Victoria. Each year SSR provides assistance to thousands of families experiencing financial disadvantage by supplying new school uniform items and footwear.

Introduction to the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) was established to provide payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports days and excursions. To find out more, or to apply for assistance, please refer to the [Department of Education](#).

SSR offers two* uniform packages each year to ALL Prep families/guardians that are eligible for CSEF funding.

Prep Autumn/Winter Uniform Package for CSEF recipients

Prep students for 2025 that are recipients of the Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) automatically qualify for the uniform package and/or voucher.

**If students received the Prep Summer Uniform Package, they are still eligible to receive the Autumn/Winter Package.*

What's in the package?

The Autumn/Winter package contains the following items:

Outerwear x 1 pce (i.e., jacket / parka / puffer)
Tops x 2 pcs (i.e., windcheater / polo shirt / rugby top)
Pants x 2 pcs (i.e., trackpants / leggings)
Socks x 2 packs
Pair of Shoes x 1

Important:

- a) PE items are not included as part of this package
- b) Shoes must be requested in UK sizes (please refer to our [shoe size conversion chart](#))

Cost to parents & guardians

Where State Schools' Relief is unable to provide a uniform item directly that contains a logo (due to contractual agreements with uniform retailers) a voucher for \$85 will be provided that subsidises the cost of the uniform item/s. The voucher can be redeemed at your child's school uniform shop or independent uniform retailer.

Please note: vouchers do have an expiry date and must be redeemed before they expire.

How do I apply for the Prep CSEF Autumn/Winter Uniform Package?

Applications are made through your child's school. Please refrain from contacting State Schools' Relief directly as we are unable to accept applications directly from parents/families. Should you have any questions, or wish to apply for assistance, please speak directly with your child's school.

How do I receive the uniform package?

All items and/or vouchers provided by SSR will be delivered directly to your child's school. The school will contact you to arrange handover of these items and/or vouchers.

Important:

Vouchers are not transferable and cannot be exchanged for cash. State Schools' Relief does not make cash payments to schools parents or guardians.

What you need to do.

Your child's school will be in contact with you regarding the 2025 Autumn/Winter Uniform Package. Please fill out the 'Prep CSEF Autumn/Winter Uniform Package Order Form' and return it to the school for submission.

'TOGETHER WE GROW'

To start primary school in 2026, your child will need to **turn 5 years old by 30 April, 2026**. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old.

Prep (Foundation) application for enrolment can be completed between the **22 April and the 25 July 2025**.

How do I enrol my child in their first year of primary school?

1. Find your local school on findmyschool.vic.gov.au website, which hosts the most up-to-date information about Victorian school zones.
2. Click to download the Prep (Foundation) enrolment information pack.
3. Click to download the Factsheet for Prep (Foundation) enrolment 2026.
4. Submit an enrolment application for Prep (Foundation) by **Friday, 25 July 2025**.

5. You will be notified of the outcome of your application between **Monday 28 July** and **Friday 8 August 2025**. If you receive an offer, you should accept the offer by **Friday 22 August 2025**.
6. Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions during Term 4 2025.
7. Your child will start Prep (Foundation) from a date advised by our school, in 2026.




