

Unfortunately, the event was cancelled due to the weather but has been rescheduled for early Term 3. All those involved are very excited about this upcoming event! Training has been in full swing and our sport stars have been fine tuning their skills each week.

Safety First – Pick-Ups and Drop-Offs

Please be reminded of the 'safety first' approach when dropping and collecting your children from school each day. We are fortunate to have a 'kiss and drop' zone along with a 'stop and chat' area at our front entrance. We share a collective responsibility to use this function with safety in mind. Please use these spaces how they are intended. Please don't park in the drop zone and if you park, please leave your car to walk and collect your children across this busy area. We do have staff on duty, but we all share responsibility for the safety of our students.

2026 Prep Enrolments

Please note that if you have siblings to enrol in Prep for 2026, I encourage you to please lodge your enrolment form asap to the school office. We are already planning for next year and are considering the intake of Preps that are already enrolled for next year.

New Timetable Trial

As shared earlier this week, we are trialing some changes to our term 3 timetable. These changes are made with a view to maximising our learning program with students in the morning sessions. This change also supports our strategy to reduce the sequential cognitive load on students across the day. In short, students have greater clarity and ability to concentrate in the morning sessions.

Within our new timetable we will be providing regular brain breaks for students. These brain breaks can occur naturally every 50 minutes and take many forms. Brain food break, hydration break, movement break, mindful break, (stretches, brain gym, breath work).

These brain breaks will support our students to re-focus for the next learning session and structured opportunities to eat/drink will be provided to maintain energy and focus.

As this rolls out, we will continue to review the impacts and whether we need to re-calibrate the lunch eating time. However, with lots of brain breaks and food provisions throughout the morning we are confident that students will maintain their focus and energy levels.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT – DARREN THRESHER

Wellbeing Curriculum – Friendology

One of the many strategies used at MEPS to promote the wellbeing of all students includes a whole school approach to actively teaching students about forming and maintaining positive relationships with others. This assists students in promoting our school values in their interactions as well as to teach them how to productively solve any potential conflicts that may arise. The use of URSTRONG's Friendology curriculum is delivered weekly with our Respectful Relationships program to engage students in important discussions regarding how to best navigate the complicated world of friendships. Some of the important skills that students learn in each year level include...



MT ELIZA PRIMARY SCHOOL
RESILIENCE RESPECT RESPONSIBILITY
CHALLENGE CONNECTEDNESS

Friendology for Early Years
From naming emotions to calm-down tips, students learn how to go from the Red to the Green-Zone. Our little ninjas learn to be Firefighters, not Firelighters, practising how to Talk-it-Out through role-play with their fuzzy friends from home.

Friendology for Year 1
From words to scripts, students learn to name their emotions and express their feelings in friendship. From role-play with teddy bears to ninja-style tricks for making new friends, children learn how to create healthy, Green-Zone friendships.

Friendology for Year 2
Students learn to treat themselves like a bestie and calm big emotions. Through role-play with stuffies, children learn to make new friends and put out their Friendship Fires®. They also learn to tune into their friend's feelings!

Friendology for Year 3
Between hurt feelings, following & copying, feeling left-out, students learn how to handle tricky friendship issues. Students learn the difference between Friendship Fires & Mean-on-Purpose behavior, locking in their very own Quick Comeback.

Friendology for Year 4
Students master the Friend-o-Cycle & the Friend-o-Meter! They learn to distinguish between Friendship Fires, Mean-on-Purpose, & Mean-by-Accident moments, addressing issues like up-and-down friends, stealing friends, & unkind jokes.

Friendology for Year 5
Friendships are a serious topic at this point, so we're digging deep into those gut-wrenching friendship issues. Groups, gossip, texting, rumours... students learn a framework & language to help them handle the tough stuff + create boundaries.

Friendology for Year 6
Jealousy, rumours, drama between friends, group chats online, and complicated Friendship Groups are hot topics! Students learn strategies to shift their mindset, helping them get more strategic and navigate difficult choices in friendship.

The URSTRONG theme for the month of June was trust. Friendology identifies trust as the “best buddy” of respect, which is one of our most important MEPS school values. Acting with integrity and being someone your friends can trust is an important part of maintaining strong and healthy relationships. On the following page is a colouring sheet that you can print off and decorate with your best colouring. Please bring your copy back to Mr Thresher and he will proudly display it in his office window to remind everyone in the yard about the importance of trust while they play with their friends.

ATTENDANCE



It is important to note that if your child/ren will be absent, you must notify the school via the Compass Education App. Compass Education provides a Parent Portal which includes the ability to mark your child/ren absent if you know your child/ren will be absent from school. Parents will need to download the Compass Education app to access this service (which is available on both Apple and Android devices).

Steps to add an absence

1. Open the Compass App.
2. Click on your child's photo at the top of the Home Screen
3. Click on **Attendance**
4. Click the blue + icon
5. From here parents can key in all information required for the absence, including dates, times and most importantly, the reason for the absence.

****Please note if parents do not enter their child's absence, you will receive a text message letting them know that the child's absence is unexplained, with a link to provide an Attendance Note on the Compass Education app and a phone call may also be made from the school as a reminder if not actioned.***

If you received a text saying your child is absent

1. Click on the link in your text message OR Follow steps 1-2 above then,
2. Click the un-explained tab at the bottom
3. Select each unexplained absence date and complete.



Enrolments are now open for all families looking to enrol their children for Prep 2026. Prep 2026 Enrolment forms can be downloaded from our website [here](#). Enrolment forms along with your child's birth certificate and immunisation certificate can be returned to the office by hand or via email to Barbara.rogers@education.vic.gov.au

Prep enrolments are due by Friday 25th July

To start primary school in 2026, your child will need to **turn 5 years old by 30 April, 2026**. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old.

Prep (Foundation) application for enrolment can be completed between the **22 April and the 25 July 2025**.

How do I enrol my child in their first year of primary school?

1. Find your local school on findmyschool.vic.gov.au website, which hosts the most up-to-date information about Victorian school zones.
2. Click to download the Prep (Foundation) enrolment information pack.
3. Click to download the Factsheet for Prep (Foundation) enrolment 2026.

4. Submit an enrolment application for Prep (Foundation) by **Friday, 25 July 2025**.
5. You will be notified of the outcome of your application between **Monday 28 July** and **Friday 8 August 2025**. If you receive an offer, you should accept the offer by **Friday 22 August 2025**.
6. Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions during Term 4 2025.
7. Your child will start Prep (Foundation) from a date advised by our school, in 2026.



Whether you're biking or riding an e-scooter, follow these simple road safety tips to stay safe and have fun on the move!

MODIFIED OR PETROL POWERED BICYCLES

- Illegal.




MOTORBIKES

- To ride on or off-road it must be registered with a full or recreation registration
- Helmet must be worn at all times.




E-BIKES

- 25 km/h MAX speed
- Motor cannot provide power at speeds higher than 25km/h
- Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- Cannot be ridden on footpaths.



E-SCOOTER

- Be aged 16 yrs or over
- Max speed 20 kmph
- Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- Cannot be ridden on footpaths.

E-scooter Road Rules

Tougher penalties as e-scooters are made permanent.

e-scooter riders cannot

- Ride on the footpath
- Use a mobile phone while riding
- Ride while under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- Carry passengers or animals or ride in tandem
- Ride a high-speed e-scooter, one capable of more than 25 km/h
- Ride on roads that have a speed limit over 60 km/h

e-scooter riders must

- Be aged 16 years and over
- Not exceed the maximum speed of 20 km/h
- Ride only on shared paths and roads that have a speed limit up to 60 km/h
- Wear a helmet at all times
- Follow traffic rules
- Use lights and reflectors
